MUSEUM OF LAKE MINNETONKA

Debuting in 1906 as an extension of the Twin Cities' streetcar system, the steamboat *Minnehaha* provided fast and reliable transportation for Lake Minnetonka residents and tourists for twenty years. After the popularity of automobiles and improved roads in the



area ended their viability in the 1920s, *Minnehaha* and some of her sisters were scuttled in 1926 and lay forgotten at the bottom of Lake Minnetonka for more than five decades. In 1980 the wreck of *Minnehaha* was discovered and raised to the surface. Following a \$500,000, volunteer-driven restoration, *Minnehaha* returned to passenger service in 1996 and has operated on Lake Minnetonka ever since.

Minnehaha is currently owned, maintained and operated by the Museum of Lake Minnetonka, a nonprofit organization based in Excelsior, Minnesota. You can now sail aboard her on weekends and holidays throughout the summer and autumn seasons.
