# Public Events Have Helped Residents Survive Long Minnesota Winters

Long, cold Minnesota winters can be excruciating, but having something to look forward to can help ease the pain. The south Lake Minnetonka area has hosted several cold weather events to distract residents from this sometimes brutal season.

In 1936, the Excelsior Civic and Commerce Association, along with help from the Works Progress Administration (WPA), American Legion, PTA, Fire Department, and Excelsior Village Council scheduled a **Kids' Klondike Carnival** for Saturday, February 15th.

As Saturday neared, the children became more and more excited knowing there would soon be sled dog races down Water Street, ice skating races, ski races, snow modeling contests, and the crowning of a carnival queen and princess atop an ice throne on Water Street. The day would end with a fancy skating exhibition and vaudeville acts furnished by the WPA on College Lake.

But, February of 1936 turned out to be one of the coldest months on record in the United States. The carnival was postponed one week due to frigid temps. As February 22nd neared, the weather was still too cold and the festivities were postponed once again. The "Minnetonka Record" stated the "kids are bursting over with enthusiasm" and "may be seen on the streets daily with skis or dog teams practicing for the great day." Finally, on Leap Day, February 29, the first Kids' Klondike Carnival was held and for four years in a row: 1936, 1937, 1938, and 1939, the carnival continued.

In 1937, Annette Colburn of Excelsior, a repeat winner of the "Star Tribune's" "Dog Derby" which ran for 18 years in Minneapolis, was the winner of the dog sled race at the Kids' Klondike Carnival.

On February 17, 1973, the 1st annual Sled Dog Race was held on Lake Minnetonka where 68 teams of "mushers" and their dogs started and ended at



the Excelsior Commons. This was much different than the sled dog races held during the Klondike Kids' Carnival where

children tied their mutts to a sled while they kneeled or sat, hoping the dog would run and the sled wouldn't tip over.

The Sled Dog Race was sponsored by the Greater Excelsior Area Chamber of Commerce and North Star Sled Dog Club. The purse was \$300 and entrants came from many northern Minnesota cities. A cross country ski race and a junior hockey game were also planned.

The following year, the same group gathered again and this time 70 teams raced for the top spot. In 1975, the race was cancelled due to ice conditions. But in 1980 and three times in the 1990's, the dogs were back racing for as much as \$7,500 in 1998.

This winter the Lake Minnetonka Klondike Derby will be held February 9th starting at 10 a.m. on Water Street in Excelsior. For more info, go to www.klondikedogderby.com.


Another winter community event was held on March 5, 1977. Sno-Cup Day involved all the south shore cities and was sponsored by the Excelsior Boosters. The day began with a mutt and sleigh race and was followed by a snow fort building contest, cross country ski race, and food vendors.

council members and citizens racing in an obstacle course. Tonka Bay was the victor. The day ended with a sleigh and cutter parade down Water Street complete with prizes.



# **Postcards of Lake Minnetonka** with Chuck Donley




