The Harborage

Celebrating 50 Years of History

First in a series exploring ELMHS' first fifty years.

Fifty years is a long time in "non-profit years." But the evolution of organizations collecting history in the Lake Minnetonka area goes back much farther than that.

For instance, there was a mention of a "Lake Minnetonka Historical Society" in an 1891 issue of the *Minneapolis Tribune* just 38 years after the settlers first arrived in our area. Our history was also collected by

the Minnesota Historical Society, St. Paul (founded 1849), the Western Hennepin County Pioneer Association, Long Lake (founded 1907), Hennepin County Historical Society, Minneapolis, (founded 1938, now Hennepin History Museum), the Minnetonka Historical Museum Association, Mound (founded 1966, now Westonka Historical Society) and the Minnetonka Historical Society, Minnetonka (founded 1970). And in 1972, the Excelsior-Lake Minnetonka Historical Society (ELMHS) sprang into being.

The early 1970s brought preparations for the celebration of the US Bicentennial in 1976 and inspired a patriotic fervor and a renewed interest in history across the county. This gave birth to hundreds of local historical societies. Even "young" Lake Minnetonka, known mostly by Native people until settlers arrived in 1853, caught the history bug. The community felt that if they were going to celebrate their history, they'd better find out what it was and have something to show for it. Today, fifty years after the 1972 founding of the Excelsior-Lake Minnetonka Historical Society, we will explore the Society's history - remembering those who brought it into being and those who kept us going for half a century.

Lake Minnetonka Historical Organizations Strategic Alliance Update

The ELMHS continues to partner with Deephaven Historical Society, the Museum of Lake Minnetonka, Wayzata Historical Society, and Westonka Historical Society to explore ways that our organizations can collaborate to better serve the history of the Lake Minnetonka area, now and in the future. Having completed a benchmarking study, stakeholder interviews, town hall meetings and a community/ member survey, our consultant, Arts Consulting Group, is now conducting a financial analysis of the groups. The Joint Committee is currently exploring incremental consolidation models while our boards conduct site visits and learn more about each organization. The partners are excited to share the results of this study later in the year and welcome any questions about the process.

ELMHS Technology Update

Thanks to our members' and contributors' financial support, ELMHS has begun a long-delayed technology planning process to determine our direction and needs over the next five years. We are looking to use new and upgraded technology to:

- Improve our collection digitization, cataloging, indexing and storage;
- Build more efficient workflows for the management of memberships, volunteers, and donations; and,
- Open up new venues of education and outreach to the community and historical researchers.

Some early initiatives include:

- Determining a plan for new hardware and software purchases required in the next one, three and five-year time horizons;
- Upgrading our CRM and online exhibit software;
- Designing and developing a mobile app for visitors to the Excelsior and Lake Minnetonka area to find and learn about its historical locations and stories.


Passionate Beginnings

Inspired by the upcoming Bicentennial, a group of five passionate and enterprising women - Kari Rice, Mary Hearing, Fern Michael, Mary Willis and Fran Windmuller - set out to fill a void in their historic community by looking for a way to preserve the history of the south lake area. They first sought the legal advice of O'Neill Grathwol and then held a charter meeting with Lincoln and Harriet Aldritt (Tonka Bay), Mark and Grace Knowlton (Excelsior), Ruth Mann (Shorewood), Warren Morse (Excelsior), and Dave Nixon (Shorewood). Staking out their primary area of interest (Excelsior, Deephaven, Greenwood, Shorewood, and Tonka Bay) they began a non-profit organization and met for the first time on May 25, 1972. The Society's mission remains the same today:

- To preserve, document and classify the physical history of the Lake Minnetonka area.
- To provide a means by which everyone can share in the history of the lake area.
- To stimulate interest in the cultural heritage of the area.

Preserving History Made by Others

After discussing a number of name possibilities at their June meeting, the new organization settled on "Excelsior-Lake Minnetonka Historical Society" -

embracing the village of Excelsior and what was once Excelsior township – where many of them lived. The first board included Mark Knowlton President; Mary Willis, Vice President; Jean Hughes, Recording Secretary; Kari Rice, Correspondence Secretary; Fern Michael, Treasurer; and Grace Knowlton, Historian and at-large members Lincoln Aldritt, O'Neill Grathwol, Dorothea Hillis, Jane Nielsen, Dave Nixon, Gladys Peck, Robert Reutiman, Betty Wiley, and Mary Willis. Members and the public were enthusiastic about the new group and began to

donate volumes of historic material from all over the Lake Minnetonka area that needed to be organized, catalogued, and properly preserved.

Making History

The new organization hit the ground running - participating in parades, providing historical displays and programs in schools, the library, and storefronts, holding bus and boat tours, an

auction fundraiser, luncheons, and historical fashion shows. In 1978 the Excelsior City Council and the Society conducted a Historical Survey of all the properties in Excelsior, which was made into a book, The Lake, The Land and The People, by members Linn Ann Cowles and Peter Johnson. In 1980 a committee including Jerry Holl, Rachel Leonard and Leon Bonander led the restoration of the famous 1892 Lake Minnetonka sailboat the Onawa. And in 1981 a show of early pioneer Lydia Ferguson's artwork was presented to launch the publication of the Lydia Ferguson Diary, 1854-1886, compiled by member Joyce Quinn.

Leaping forward to 2003 the Society produced Excelsior's two-day, community-wide Sesquicentennial Celebration co-chaired by Don Douglass and Lisa Stevens. It featured parades, tours, a pageant, and dozens of other activities. In 2013 board members Brianna DePauw Bolin and Dan Johnson created "Tapping History" bringing hundreds of people into local establishments and aboard Lake Minnetonka boats with monthly presentations about area history. While our founding members would have been thrilled with the popularity of these standing room only events, the thought of patronizing a brewery or sipping a cocktail on the water might have elicited gasps from some of these Women's Christian Temperance Union members. To bring history home during the COVID pandemic, the Society added virtual presentations and tours in 2020 which can now be viewed around the world on demand. (We're *sure* this would *also* make our founders gasp.)







Publications

Publishing books was a natural for the Society as there was no shortage of talented and enthusiastic historians and writers, plenty of unexplored history to mine and a hungry public to be served. These books also served the Society's mission and provided a major source of income. The Society's first book, published in 1974, was a reprint of S.E. Ellis' *Picturesque Minnetonka 1906.* In 1978 member Ellen Wilson Meyer came forward with her talent and generosity, writing seven books about Lake Minnetonka area history and leant financial assistance in their early production costs. The Society also benefited from the literary talents of other members including Isabel Thibault and Grace Knowlton, and was lucky to have Ron Hughes of Tonka Printing in Excelsior,



always ready with his pre-digital era publishing support and expertise.

The Society has gone on to publish over twenty books in the last 50 years - most recently, *Images of America:* Lake Minnetonka, co-authored with the Wayzata and Westonka historical societies. Many of our original publications, and one of a kind framed maps and apparel, may be purchased via the Society's website today.
