

Society's Historic "Onawa," Digitized

Aritime Heritage Minnesota (MHM) of St. Paul has been awarded a Minnesota Historical and Cultural Heritage Grant (part of the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund of the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment) to document four Minnesota-produced vessels located in two museum's collections. One of the vessels to be studied is the Excelsior-Lake Minnetonka Historical Society's "Onawa", constructed by Dyer Boat Works in Deephaven. The other watercraft chosen for this project are a Dakota birch bark canoe constructed in

Mendota in Dakota County, an Ojibwe birch bark canoe constructed in the Rainy Lake Region in the northern counties of Koochiching and St. Louis, and a wooden and canvas duck boat built at Parker's Prairie Boat Works in Otter Tail County curated at the Minnesota Historical Society in St. Paul. In the past, present, and into the future, Minnesota's and rivers have and will provide transportation routes, food sources, and places for recreation. Smaller watercraft have supplied Minnesotans with a means to exploit, use, benefit from, and enjoy the bodies of water around them

Underwater Archaeology: New Anomalies of Lake Minnetonka

with Ann Merriman PhD & Christopher Olson MA

Maritime Heritage Minnesota, a nautical archaeology and maritime history not-for-profit organization, has been conducting studies in Lake Minnetonka to identify, document, preserve, and conserve wrecks and other submerged cultural resources. Ann Merriman PhD and Christopher Olson MA will present an update from their talk of October, 2014. At that time, 36 wrecks had been identified on the bottom of Lake Minnetonka. An additional 30 wrecks have been identified in the lake by MHM's staff, the only underwater archaeologists working in Minnesota, and their small group of volunteers.



he preservation and conservation of these vessels is paramount in telling the maritime history of Minnesota - our shared maritime legacy. The curation and storage of these vessels will be augmented with detailed documentation and historical research to place them into the greater context of Minnesota's Maritime History through this project. Aspects of this history include not only vessel use, but the local construction of purposebuilt watercraft. MHM chose these four watercraft for study based on their design: shallow draft, lightly built, and wood construction meant specifically to function with a low freeboard.

The small vessels preserved in controlled museum environments serve as the researcher's source to take

preservation one step further: detailed documentation and 3D scanning. In terms of the "Onawa", the wooden sailing racer was designed by 15 year old Ward Burton and constructed by Arthur Dyer on Lower Lake Minnetonka in 1893. This vessel changed the face of small craft racing not only on Lake Minnetonka, but Minnesota and arguably inland racing in the Midwest and beyond. Burton's design idea for "Onawa" stemmed from his use of his own birch bark canoe – his 'Indian Canoe' as he called it - and how it 'glided' on top of the water. Therefore, "Onawa" was developed by European Americans adapting

Native American knowledge and design into a competitive racing sloop.

MHM will measure, analyze, and produce 3D scans of the four watercraft focused on in this study. The accumulated data will allow MHM to describe each watercraft, write histories of the boat-builders that span the years 1880-1933, and write histories for each vessel. The information derived from this study will be shared with the general public and scholars through written reports and 3D graphics. MHM will stress the significance of each watercraft to the institutions that hold them, sharing data and analysis of each artifact and explaining their object's place among the corpus of Minnesota small craft. MHM intends for this information to be utilized by the museums as part of their public programs and initiatives.

Maritime Heritage Minnesota is a 501.c(3) organization dedicated to the preservation, conservation, documentation, and when necessary, the excavation of Minnesota's finite maritime and nautical archaeological and historical resources within a not-for-profit paradigm where the health and safety of the artifacts is paramount. Beyond the type of watercraft studies described above, MHM conducts side and down imaging sonar surveys of Minnesota's lakes and rivers in order to identify submerged cultural resources and to investigate them underwater to determine their exact nature. In Lake Minnetonka since 2010, MHM has completed two sonar surveys of the Upper and Lower Lakes and investigated 266 anomalies. When this work began, six wrecks were recognized by the State of Minnesota; to date, MHM has identified 60 additional wrecks (and dozens of other sites and objects) on the lake bottom – and the work continues with hundreds of more

anomalies yet to be investigated.
